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### 0. INTRODUCTION

#### 0.1. "OMNI" ATTRIBUTES OF GOD

• (1) <u>omni</u>potence, (2) <u>omni</u>science, (3) <u>omni</u>presence

[CHAMBERS] We get into difficulties over God becoming Incarnate when we bring in our own conceptions. For instance, we say that the **essential** nature of God is **omnipotence**, **omnipresence**, and **omniscience**; the New Testament reveals that the <u>essential nature of God is holiness</u>, and that He became the weakest thing in His own creation, viz., a Baby.<sup>1</sup>

#### 0.2. "THE REVISED IDEA OF GOD"

#### 0.2.1. OUR "INABILITY" TO THINK ABOUT THE REAL GOD

- Strawman Fallac: Substituting a person's actual position or argument with a distorted, exaggerated, or misrepresented version of the position of the argument.
- Charles HARTSHORNE<sup>2</sup> Omnipotence and Other Theological Mistakes, Albany : State Univ. NY, 1984:

(1) First Mistake: God Is Absolutely Perfect and Therefore Unchangeable. (2) Second Mistake: <u>Omnipotence.</u> (3) Third Mistake: Omniscience. (4) Fourth Mistake: God's Unsympathetic Goodness. (5) Fifth Mistake: Immortality as a Career after Death. (6) Sixth Mistake: Revelation as Infallible.

[PERRAULT *Le chat botte*] 'I have been told,' said the cat, 'that you have the gift of turning yourself into all kinds of animals, for instance, that you could change into a lion or an elephant.' #### 0.2.2. GREAT INVENTIVENESS IN THINKING ABOUT THE WORLD

- physics Einstein; Bohr; Heisenberg; ... Hawking
  - "miracles" of <u>time-travel</u>; "miracles" of getting <u>something</u> out of <u>nothing</u> (the law of conservation of mass?); "miracles" of the <u>dark matter, dark energy</u>; "miracles" of <u>parallel</u> <u>universes</u>...
- mathematics set theory...
  - $\Rightarrow$  great imaginations; paradoxes; contradictions...

Though it has at various times been triumphed, mocked, misinterpreted, and ignored, the concept of higher dimensions beyond space and time has become a central feature of modern theoretical discussion. If it is true, it would mean that the world we perceive is only a fraction of a greater invisible reality. Length, width, breadth, and duration would be supplemented by unseen directions, outside the range of our senses.<sup>3</sup>

## 0.3. PROBLEMS WITH THE IDEA OF OMNIPOTENCE

- [AQUINAS] I q. 25 a. 3 arg. 2 "Praeterea, peccare aliquid agere est. Sed Deus non potest peccare, neque seipsum negare, ut dicitur 2Tim. 2:13 (...if we are faithless, he remains faithful- for he cannot deny himself.). Ergo Deus non est omnipotens." ... To sin is to fall short of a perfect action hence the power to sin is the power to fall short in action, which is repugnant to omnipotence. Therefore it is that God cannot sin, because of His Omnipotence."
- [BAVINCK] God "...cannot <u>lie</u>, he cannot <u>repent</u>, he cannot <u>change</u>, he cannot be <u>tempted</u> (Nu 23:19; 1Sa 15:29; Heb 6:18; James 1:13, 17), and he cannot deny himself (2Tim 2:13)".

[SWINBURNE] A logically impossible action is not an action. It is what is described by a form of words which purport to describe an action, but do not describe anything which it is coherent to suppose could be done. It is no objection to ^4's omnipotence that he cannot make a square circle. This is because 'making a square circle' does not describe anything which it is coherent to suppose could be done.<sup>4</sup>

## 0.4. THE UNITY OF GOD'S ATTRIBUTES

## 0.5.1. THE WORDS

- דעד 191x (יְהוָה צָבָאוֹת)  $\rightarrow$  the LORD of hosts (ESV); the LORD God Almighty (NIV);
- δεσπότης (lord, master, owner אָרוֹן) → Sovereign Lord (ESV); Jos 5:14 He said, "No; rather I indeed come now as captain of the host of the LORD." And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and bowed down, and said to him, "What has my lord to say to his servant?"
- God Most High (ESV); Ps 47:2 For <u>the LORD</u>, the <u>Most High</u>, is to be feared, a great king over all the earth.
- אל שָׁרַי ("všemohúci" Roh 59x, SEP 56x) God Almighty (ESV) **Gn 17:1** When Abram was ninety-nine years old the LORD appeared to Abram and said to him, "<u>I am God **Almighty**</u>; walk before me, and be blameless,

- Gn 18:14 Is anything too difficult for the LORD? (הֵיפָלֵא מֵיְהוָה דְבָר)

## 1.1. THE POWER OF GOD'S BEING

- (we have discussed it under the title "The Life of God")
- the power of His life  $\rightarrow$  aseitas; glory; YHWH
- Ex 33:20 ...man shall not see me and live. (לא־יָרָאַנִי הָאָרָם וָהָי)

## **1.2.** THE POWER OF GOD'S WILL

- Rev 4:11 "Worthy are you, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created (ὅτι σὺ ἔκτισας τὰ πάντα καὶ διὰ τὸ θέλημά σου ἦσαν καὶ ἐκτίσθησαν).
- the power to CREATE: Gn 1:1 "If it creates of nothing, it is then omnipotent..."
- the power to SUSTAIN the creation: **Heb 1:3** ... he upholds the universe by the word of his power
- the power to RAISE THE DEAD (Eph 1:19 the immeasurable greatness of his power toward us who believe, according to the working of his great might κατὰ τὴν ἐνέργειαν τοῦ κράτους τῆς ἰσχύος αὐτοῦ)

# 2. THE EXECUTION OF THE POWER OF GOD

# 2.1. DIRECT

- the Word  $\rightarrow$  Gen 1:3, 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 24, (26  $\rightarrow$  "let us make")
- the Spirit of God  $\rightarrow$

# **2.2. DELEGATED** ( $\rightarrow$ FAITH)

- Ex 3:14 God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And he said, "Say this to the people of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you."
- Ex 4:16 He shall <u>speak for you to the people</u>, and he shall be your mouth, and you shall be as God to him. (הוא יִהְיָה־לְּךָ לְפֶה וְאַתָּה תַּהְיֶה־לוֹ לֵאלֹהִים)
- ἀπόστολος (apostle) Rom 1:1 ... an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,
- χριστός (anointed) Acts 4:26 The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were gathered together, against the Lord and against his Anointed'

## 2.3. INDIRECT

- 1Chr 21:1 Then <u>Satan</u> stood against Israel and <u>incited David</u> to number Israel.
- 2Sa 24:1 Again the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel, <u>and he incited David</u> against them, saying, "Go, number Israel and Judah."
- the Cross  $\rightarrow$  Satan's defeat

# 3. GOD'S POWER FOR FAITH

• Ps 62:11 [SPURGEON] "Twice have I heard this." Our meditative soul should hear the echo of God's voice again and again. What he speaks once in <u>revelation</u>, we should be always hearing. <u>Creation</u> and <u>providence</u> are evermore echoing the voice of God"<sup>7</sup>

[TOZER] Omnipotence is not a name given to the sum of all power, but an attribute of a personal God we Christians believe to be <u>the Father of our Lord Jesus</u> Christ and of all who believe on Him to life eternal. The worshipping man finds this knowledge a source of wonderful strength for his inner life. <u>His faith rises to take</u> <u>the great leap upward into the fellowship of Him who can do whatever He wills to do</u>, for whom nothing is hard or difficult because He possesses power absolute.

# 4. TO REMEMBER

- Allow the omnipotence of God to be beyond your understanding. ("Let God be God!")
- Be sure to use the power, God delegated to you, faithfully.
- Make the power of God your source of faith and confidence.
