Col 2:13-15 And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. ¹⁵ He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

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0. INTRODUCTION

0.1. **JESUS – A VICTIM?**

• Luke 23:27-28 And there followed him a great multitude of the people and of women who were mourning and lamenting for him. ²⁸ But turning to them Jesus said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children.

0.2. JESUS – THE MASTER OF THE SITUATION

• **John 19:10-11** So Pilate said to him, "You will not speak to me? Do you not know that I have authority to release you and authority to crucify you?" ¹¹ Jesus answered him, "You would have no authority over me at all unless it had been given you from above....

1. JESUS' LOVE FOR GOD (LOVE & SUFFERING)

- → loving God more than humans; more than self
- the problem anthropocentrism → if there is a "god" he must be there for me
- Augustine: "You have made us for yourself, **O Lord**, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

1.1. JESUS' MASTER MOTIVE

→ his master motive was to please God:

- John 8:29 The one who sent me is with me; he has not left me alone, for I always do what pleases him.
- John 4:32 "I have food to eat that you do not know about

1.2. LOVE & SUFFERING

- suffering <u>received</u> from the FATHER:
- **John 18:11** So Jesus said to Peter, "Put your sword into its sheath; shall I not drink the cup that the Father has given me?"
- John 16:32-33 Behold, the hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each to his own home, and will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone, for the Father is with me. ³³ I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

2. JESUS' FAITH IN GOD (FAITH & DEATH)

- → resurrection
- 1Cor 15:19 If in this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied.

2.1. FAITH AND SUCCESS

- getting vs. giving;
- giving life (sacrifice)
- Luke 12:50 I have a baptism to be baptized with, and how great is my distress until it is accomplished!
- Mt 17:22-23 Jesus said to them, "The Son of Man is about to be delivered into the hands of men, ²³ and they will kill him, and he will be raised on the third day."

2.2. FAITH AND SACRIFICE

• **John 6:51** I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. And the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.

3. JESUS' HOPE IN GOD (HOPE & FAILURE)

→ the future world

3.1. THE SOURCES OF MEANING

Albert Camus → the absurdity of being (this life)

[Zizek] This is the argument Žižek makes in his latest film, *The Pervert's Guide to Ideology*. ...Žižek claims: Christianity is much more atheist than the usual atheism, which can claim there is no God and so on, but nonetheless it retains a certain trust into the Big Other.

• Mt 27:46 Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

3.2. THE MEANING OF EASTER

- the coming KINGDOM the future world:
- **Isaiah 53:12** Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the <u>transgressors</u>; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.
- Mt 26:29 ...I will not drink again of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom.

4. TO REMEMBER

- Easter is about the victory of Jesus.
- To understand his victory we have to know his thoughts.
- To celebrate Easter means to be in fellowship with the resurrected Christ.
